The start point for this run is at Sainsbury's, London Rd, Thetford, IP24 3QL @ 10:00AM on Sunday 05th July

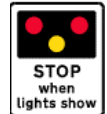
The coffee stop will be at Denver Mill, Sluice Road, Denver, PE38 OEG

The finish point is Sandringham Park Scenic Drive, Sandringham, PE35 6EH

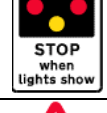

Brandon, Norfolk Surrounded by acres of forest, Brandon has a fascinating history that dates back hundreds of years, to a time when Brandon was known as Brandon Ferry and the High Street was called Ferry Street. In the words of W. G. Clarke, Brandon "is built on a gentle northern slope to the alluvium of the river-valley, which broadens out below the town and forms a tongue of the fenland.." The river once formed the boundary between Suffolk and Norfolk, Brandon falling in the main on the Suffolk side.

Denver Sluice, Norfolk In 1651 the first sluice was built across the river at Denver, by Cornelius Vermuyden, although it had to be rebuilt after bursting in 1713. The sluices play a major role in the drainage of the fens, being at the confluence of five watercourses. The area is now enjoyed by many tourists, and Denver Sluice is the home of the local sailing club.

RAF Marham, Norfolk RAF Marham is one of the largest and busiest bases in the RAF, operating 4 Squadrons of Tornado GR4 aircraft in the attack and reconnaissance roles. In addition to those, the Station is home to a number of other key RAF units such as the Tornado Forward Support Wing, Depth Support Wing, Base Support Wing, No 3 (RAF) Force Protection Wing, the Tactical Imagery Intelligence Wing, the Tornado Maintenance School, No 93 Expeditionary Armament Squadron, the Tornado Engineering Development and Investigation Team and 2620 Squadron Royal Auxiliary Air Force Regiment.

Dersingham and Sandringham Sandringham House, a favoured holiday home of Queen Elizabeth and several of her predecessors, lies just to the south of Dersingham in the parish of Sandringham. The estate was purchased by the royal family in 1882 from the Hon Charles Spencer Cowper for £220,000, three times its actual value, Mr Cowper needed the money to pay off gambling debts. In the Past the Hotel opposite the estate had some of King Edward VII Mistress's staying as guests, including a certain Lilly Langtree.
